Bowel Cancer Awareness Month

During April's Bowel Cancer Awareness Month our campaign contributed to a 58% increase in calls to our information line in the three weeks from 7-28 April 2023, compared to the previous period.

In April, traffic to *bowelscreen.ie* led to three times as much engagement with the website compared to March. Positively, nearly 3,000 people checked the BowelScreen register in April, up from just over 300 in March.

Diabetic retinopathy screening for pregnant women being rolled out



In mid-June, the Diabetic RetinaScreen programme will formally launch a new retinopathy screening pathway for women who have Type 1 or Type 2 diabetes and become pregnant. The programme has worked with the country's 19 maternity units to make this service available nationally, following a pilot in the Dublin maternity units.
