# Minister Donnelly launches new diabetic retinopathy pathway for pregnant women

On 14 June, Minister for Health Stephen Donnelly joined the NSS in the Mater Misericordiae University Hospital in Dublin to launch a new Diabetic RetinaScreen (DRS) screening initiative for women who have diabetes and become pregnant. The risk of diabetic retinopathy may increase during pregnancy and this new initiative provides more frequent screening to women, protecting their sight during pregnancy.

## CervicalCheck discusses interval cancer reviews with Norwegian screening agency

CervicalCheck Clinical Director Professor Nóirín Russell and Programme Manager Gráinne Gleeson met the Norwegian cervical screening programme *Kreftregisteret* in Oslo, to discuss best practise for personal cervical screening reviews. The meetings also discussed the process of interval cancer reviews and disclosure, and the experiences of the Irish programme.

There was a joint workshop in the Norwegian Department of Health with Norwegian breast screening clinicians, and their programme leads for breast and cervical screening. They discussed interval cancer audits, and how and when women should be informed of audit results.

# **Conference round-up**

**RCPI Summer Scientific Meeting:** Director of Evaluation in our Programme Evaluation Unit Professor Patricia Fitzpatrick gave a presentation titled *The co-development of a tailored smoking cessation protocol for and with cancer patients.* NSS Public Health Officers also presented at the meeting, which took place at the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland (RCPI), on 23-24 May.

**European Diabetic Eye Disease Conference**: Diabetic RetinaScreen (DRS) Clinical Director Professor David Keegan addressed the European Diabetic Eye Disease Conference in Coimbra, Portugal, on 2 June, with a presentation titled *Results of the two-year screening interval initiative within the Irish National Diabetic Retinopathy Screening Programme*.

International Cancer Screening Network (ICSN) conference: Our Programme Evaluation Unit presented findings from the Core Research survey at the ICSN conference in Turin, Italy, on 21–23 June. They presented five posters, covering the findings of the survey that explored what drives and inhibits people to attend screening; the impact of COVID-19 delays on colonoscopy outcomes; and the findings of a survey into interval cancer rates in cervical screening programmes.
