HSE National Clinical Lead for Critical Care Martina was appointed as Consultant in Our Lady's Children's Hospital, Crumlin in 2000 and has been a strong advocate for the development of Paediatric Intensive Care

services in Ireland. She was the National Clinical Lead for Paediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) and led the HSE Steering Group for the Model of Care in PICU who published the first Model of Care for PICU in Ireland.

In 2018 she was appointed National Clinical Lead for Sepsis where she led the development and implementation of the National Paediatric Sepsis Guideline within the acute paediatric healthcare setting in Ireland. Her focus centred on guideline implementation encompassing sepsis education for both clinical staff and the public. Martina was appointed National Clinical Lead for Critical Care in 2023 and she continues to advise the National Sepsis Programme on the early recognition and management of sepsis in children. She is also an Associate Professor.

Turlough is a consultant in Paediatric Emergency Medicine in Children's Health Ireland at Tallaght since 2009. He is dual

qualified as a paediatrician and GP and is a fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland since 2019. He was the former president of the Irish Paediatric Association from 2017-2019.
